From the Principal

Dear Paradise Families,

Term 3 is well under way with many exciting things happening here at Paradise. Last week we began our Deep Learning journey. Students were given the topic “In The Dark” and they have been exploring their own learning in this area. We are very excited to share our journey with you in week 8 of this term. This learning integrates many areas of the curriculum and assessment will be based on the 6 Global Competencies. These are Citizenship, Collaboration, Critical Thinking, Creativity, Communication and Character. Save the date on the 10th September to learn more.

We have managed to arrange R-5 swimming for week 5 this term and for this year we will at the ARC. This has enabled us to free up term 4 slightly as it was shaping up to be an extremely busy term.

Paradise Projects has also returned on Friday afternoons. Students have remained in the same groups as last term giving all students an opportunity to participate in all 6 activities. Students and Teachers thoroughly enjoy Friday afternoons, working with other peers and learning through different areas. We are extremely happy to welcome The Campbelltown Salvation Army to our school community. The Salvation Army are running our Junior and Senior Choir every Tuesday as well as the Just Brass program at lunchtime. If you are interested in your child participating in Just Brass, please ask at the front office. The Campbelltown Salvation Army are also hiring our gym every Sunday for the next few months until their new premises are built.

Regretfully, I must inform the community at the end of this term, Paradise for Kids, our out of school hours and vacation care service, will be shutting its doors. This is a decision that has not been made easily or quickly by Governing Council. The service has been struggling over the last 2 years and can no longer be maintained. On a positive note Happy Haven at Charles Campbell College have come on board to support us with providing care for all students at Paradise Primary School. Happy Haven will run a bus to and from Paradise daily for a minimal transport cost. As the session rates are considerably cheaper than what we have been

able to charge at Paradise for Kids, this will be no extra cost to parents. I would also like to remind our community of a couple of important rules that we all must follow to keep everyone at Paradise safe.

1. Between the hours of 8:15 and 9:30 and 2:30 and 3:30 the George Street carpark is out of bounds to all vehicles other than staff, disabled permit holders and maintenance workers. If you are dropping children off within these times, please use the Harris Street carpark.
2. COVID-19 restrictions remain in place at our site. Parents and Carers are not permitted to enter the school buildings. All visitors on site must complete a COVID-19 Site Entry Form prior to entering any building. All visitors will be asked to complete one of these forms prior to attending all school events. This includes assemblies, basketball training, teacher meetings etc.





In B3 we have been continuing with our persuasive topic to start the term. The students needed to convince Mr Barabas to agree with a topic that they felt passionate about.
